

AP – European History

Summer Assignment

The summer assignment consists of 3 main parts and is due on the first day of school

Part I: Maps :

- designed to help students familiarize themselves with essential elements of current European geography and key locations of historical events.
- Listed locations are to be clearly labeled on the provided maps.
- Map locations must be memorized. Country locations will be tested on the first day of school. All other locations will be tested in the first unit test.

Part II: Geographic 3D Model

- Intended to help students familiarize themselves with topography and key countries of Europe.
- Must show relative elevation (sea level/low, landforms/medium, mountains/high)
- May work in group of up to 3 people.
- Must show **evidence of product and process** through pictures or video.

Part III: Timeline

- Intended to develop a *working* understanding of chronology and cause and effect.
- Must show all events/time periods and their chronological relationship to each other.
- Events and years are to be memorized. Timeline will be tested in the first week of school.
- More detailed timeline will be assigned after the first unit, to be used and tested throughout the year.
- Must directly label events/years on timeline. Do not use numbered/labeled (abbreviated) key.

For each map listed below, locate and neatly label the following information. You will be graded on factors such as neatness and accuracy of relative location. You will be tested on this information during the first two weeks of school, including a countries test on the first day. When labeling locations, **do not use a numbered or patterned "key"**. Please write the location names directly on the map (you may abbreviate some of the countries as indicated in brackets). Memorize locations, to be tested in the first unit of the course. Country locations to be tested on the first day of school.

Part II. Geographic 3D Model (individual or in groups of up to 3 people)

Create a 3 dimensional model, clearly depicting the underlined elements in part I, using the following guidelines.

- Must show *relief* (landscape/relative elevation).
- Must show required elements (underlined above)- abbreviations are acceptable.
- Exact borders are not completely necessary, but relative locations must be accurate.
- Must have clear evidence of finished product: Model may be brought to school or you may take pictures (at least 6 pictures) or video showing all aspects of the model, including group members working on it.
- Must have clear evidence of process make sure you provide pictures of all participants in the process of making the model.
- Possible media include, but not limited to: playdough, clay, sand, dirt (landscaping), grass (mown into lawn), paper mache, salt-dough sculpture, , etc. (be creative!).

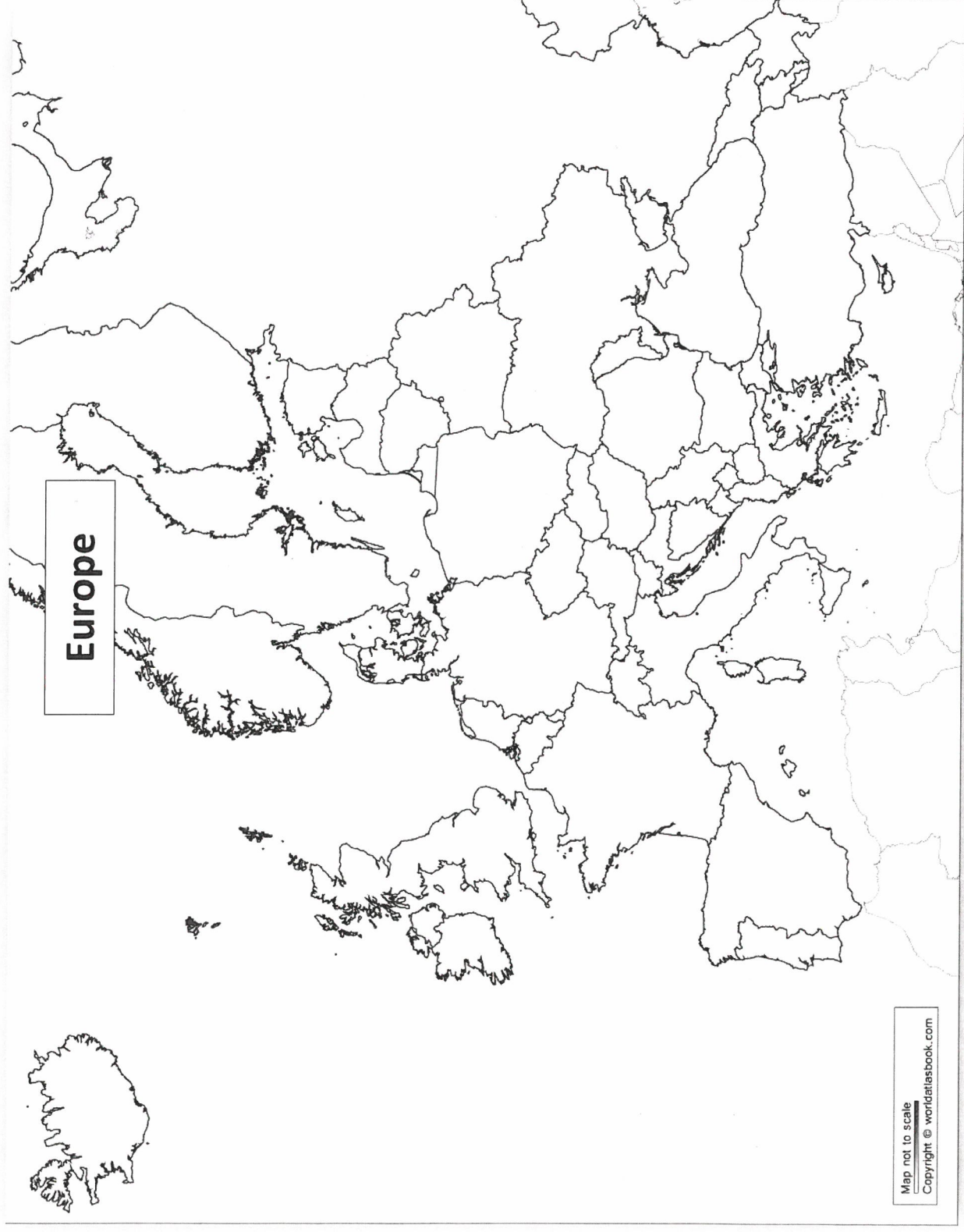
III. Timeline (individual)

On one side of paper (or several papers taped together), **create a hand-drawn timeline** depicting the following events/years (listed below) under the following guidelines:

- Draw by hand, colors are helpful, but not absolutely necessary.
- Clearly and proportionally label relevant centuries: 1400, 1500, 1600, 1700, 1800, 1900, 2000
- Clearly label all events and corresponding years
- Clearly show relevance of events to each other by position. Overlapping or simultaneous time periods must overlap. Disparate events must be separated appropriately.
- Memorize all events, to be tested during the first unit.
- c. = circa (around, about, approximately)

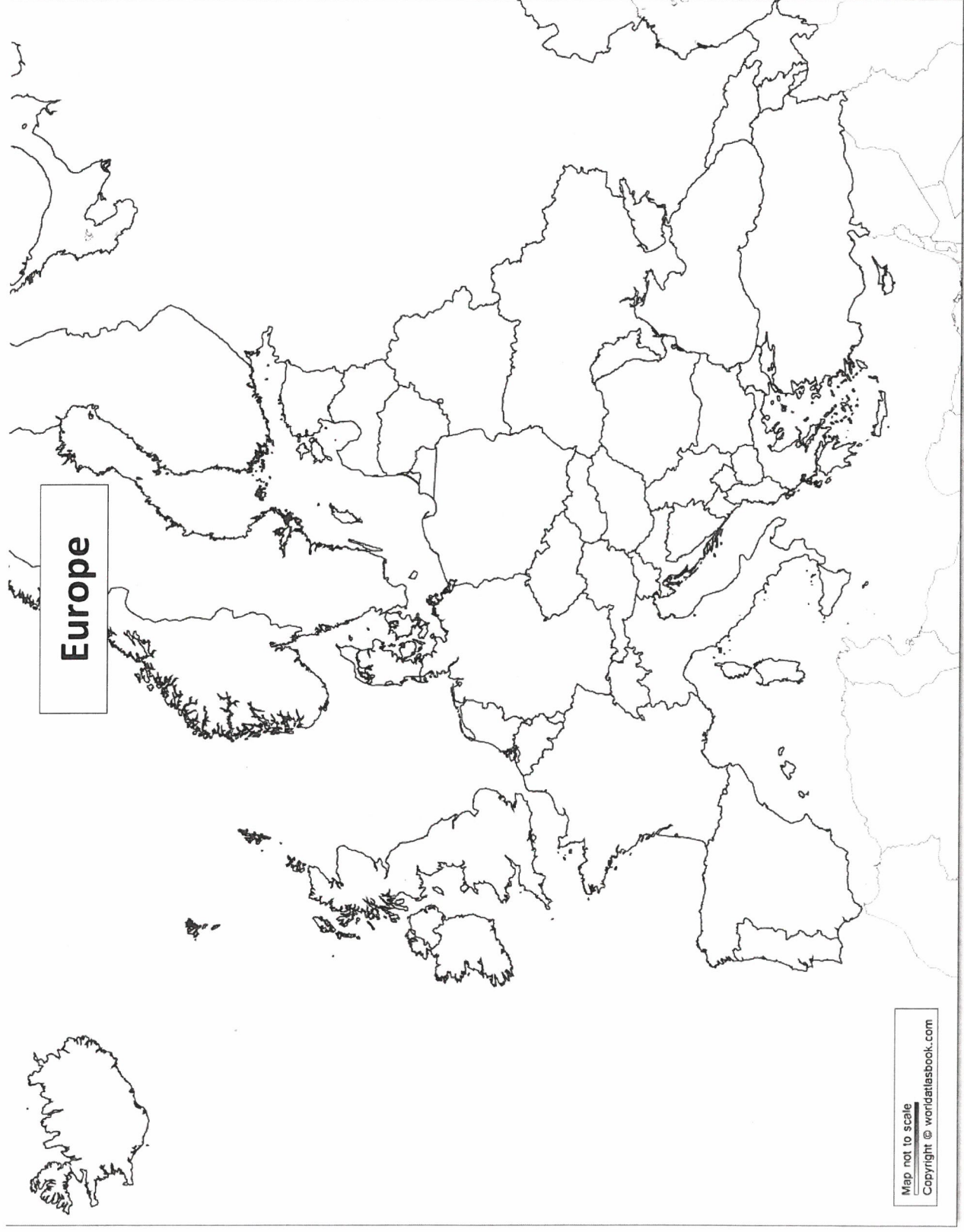

Map 1: Countries



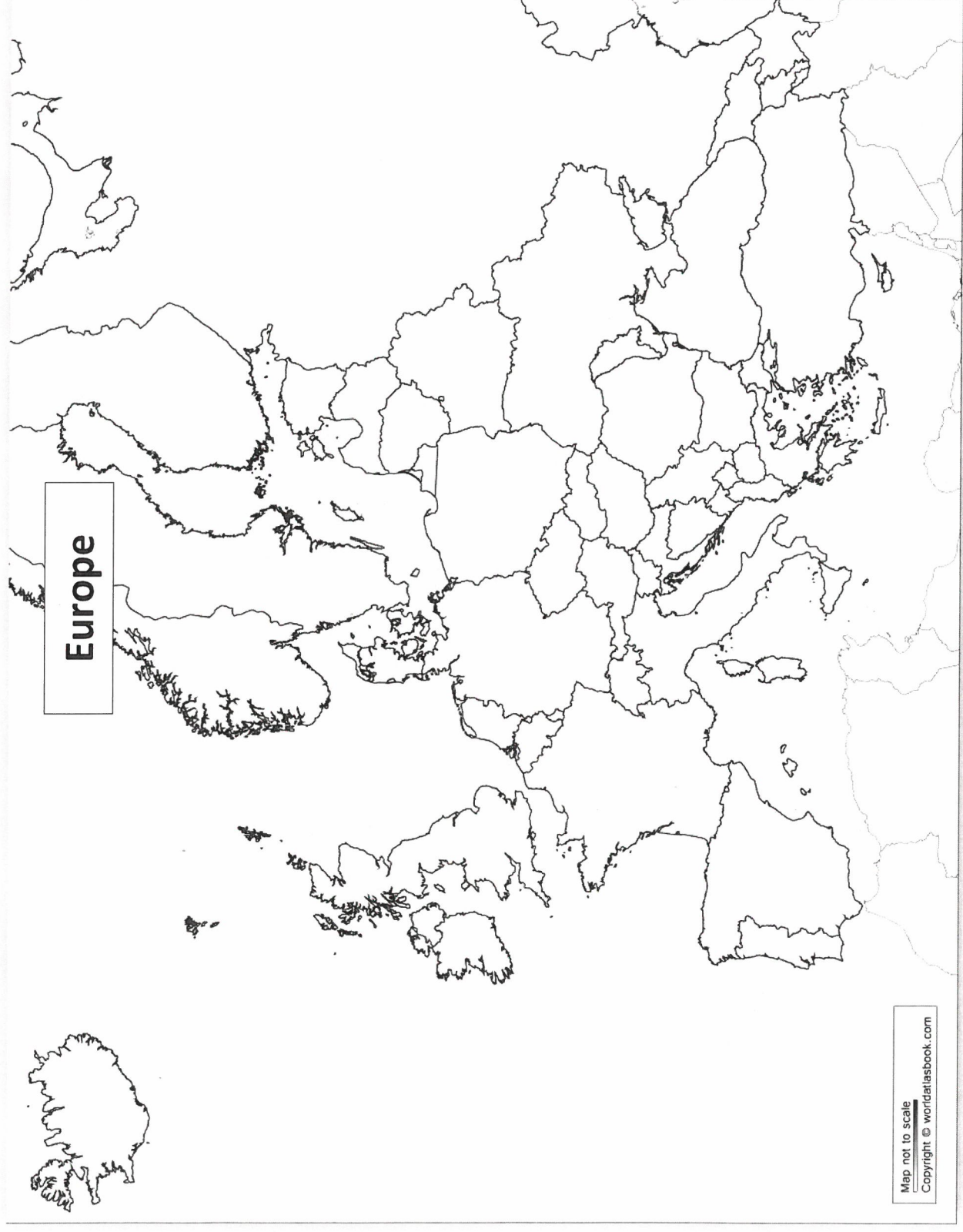

Map 2: Cities



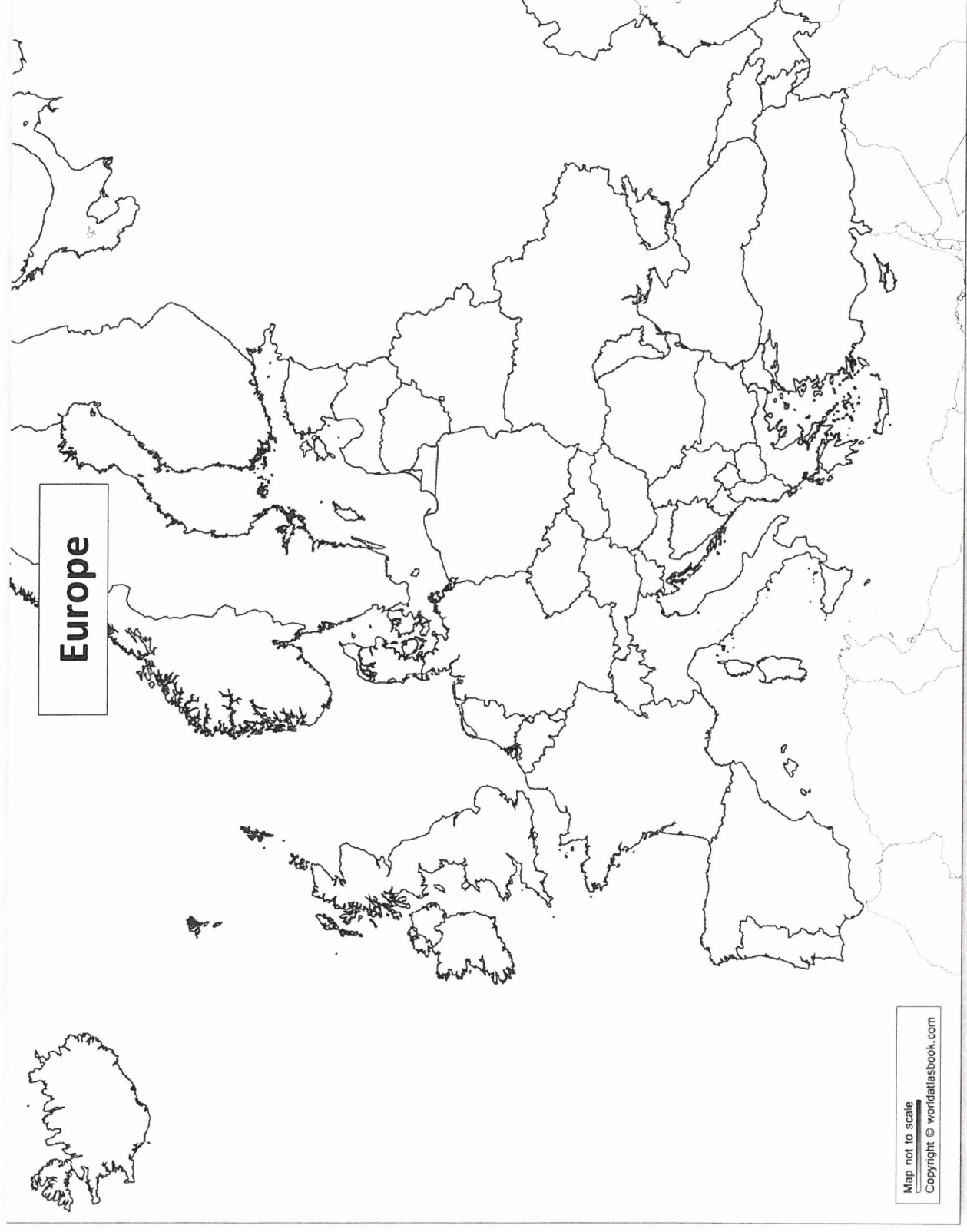
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Map 3: Regions/Peninsulas/Mountains
